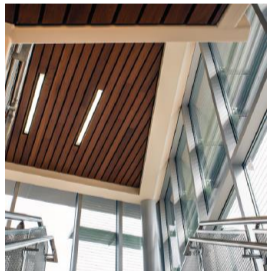
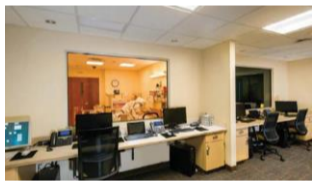

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Lathrop Hall was built in 1951 and originally served as a 30,478 SF student union and dining hall. Prior to the project, the building housed traditional classrooms, miscellaneous administrative functions, and the University Police Department.

This project was an \$11 million redesign to create a School of Nursing that reflects modern healthcare and educational practices. The University Police continue to occupy the ground level of the complex in a renovated, accessible, new command & control center. The design included enhanced technology, new windows, roof, interior walls and finishes, and building-wide MEP systems. State-of-the-art laboratories and classrooms, group study areas, large group meeting spaces and swing spaces make Lathrop a prime example of higher education learning facilities. The project was designed to LEED Silver specifications.
